Notes from Pinvin Parish Council

Members of the Parish Council met with County Cllr Tucker and a representative from Worcestershire County Council Highways before Christmas to discuss options to address speeding concerns in the village. These will be considered by members of the Parish Council and further updates provided once proposals have been agreed. Speed signage has also been inspected and any issues reported to the County Council for their action.



Thanks are extended to those parishioners who responded to the Council's request and suggestions in relation to New Homes bonus funding available in the Parish. This source of funding is available towards enhancing community facilities and services in the village. Projects will be considered further by Councillors at their January meeting ahead of applications for consideration following this community consultation.

Wychavon District Council has a Community Grants Scheme available to voluntary and charitable groups, the main focus being physical activity and getting people more healthy. 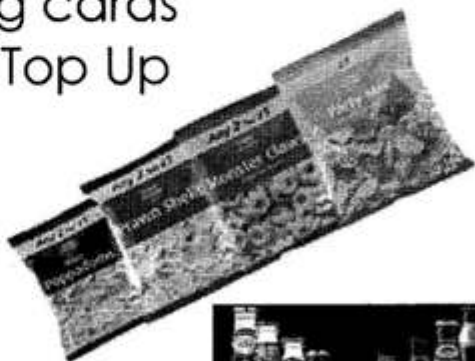

Keep Looking for Spring

On a cold grey morning, I walked in my garden and saw a great tit, a black and white bird at this time singing, trilling repeatedly as I was looking at him at eye level.

Close by I had a little nut tree planted by friend a few years ago. Today it was festooned with 3 inch tassels, yellow and green catkins. shedding much pollen. So I hope for hazelnuts in the autumn.

In general the small birds are feeding as fast as they can. They need to prepare for a severe weather spell and also for egg laying. The nests of long tail tits are fragile constructions woven from spiders webs, mosses and lichens. The chicks are so tiny perhaps 10 in a nest. No wonder they hunt in family groups for the rest of the season. Their long black tails edged with white grow from the crown.

The buds on the weeping willow are beginning to swell. They too develop catkins, good food for bees as they are all pollen producers.

I have also been delighted by a large thrush -like bird, a migrant so we only see them in cold winters, a Redwing. One has been feeding as fast as he can on my lush ripe holly berries. His under wing chest is coloured red but this is not always visible. He is striking in appearance with strong yellow eye lines and a beautiful striped breast. – just outside my kitchen window. My usual Blackbirds are now indulging in the wealth of Firethorn red berries on the Pyracantha which grows so well round another of my down stairs windows.

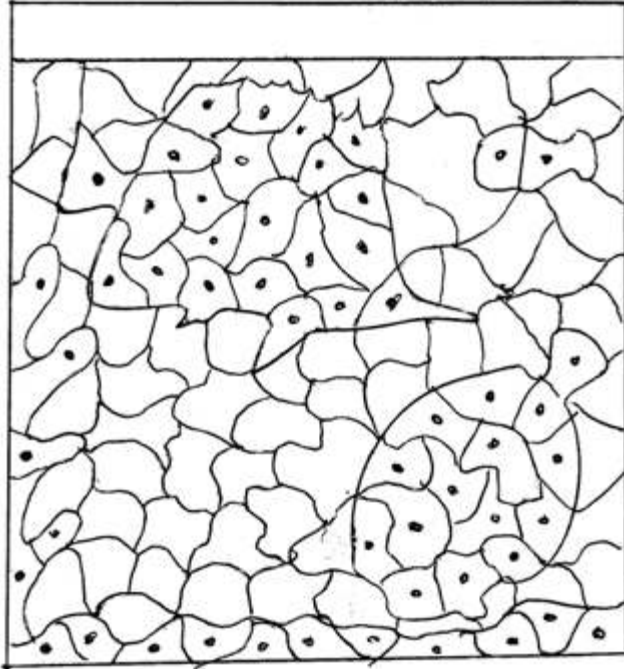

What's Cooking?

PEACH PANCAKES

100 g / 4 oz plain flour sifted

1 egg

250 ml / ½ pint milk

1 Tbsp melted butter, oil or frylight

Pinch salt

1 x 250 g can sliced peaches

1 tsp arrowroot or cornflour

1-2 tsp brandy for adults

Beat together flour, egg, milk and salt.

Drain peaches, save the juice.

Mix a little juice with the arrowroot or cornflour, heat the rest, and add to juice mixture when hot. Return to pan & heat to thicken.

Add peaches, keep warm.

Lightly brush the base of 20 cm / 8 in frying pan with fat of choice & heat pan.

Fry 2 or 3 Tablespoons of batter. Turn pancake when golden; fry the other side.

Lay pancake on serving plate. Fill ½ with hot peaches, fold over the other half.

Serve hot with whipped cream.

Pancake Day (Shrove Tuesday) February 28th.

I can't wait! Ed.
