Notes from Pinvin Parish Council

Traffic calming is primarily the responsibility of the County Council, with speed enforcement lying with the police and the Road Safety Partnership. Given the large area these agencies cover and the lack of funding they receive, the general opinion is that they do little to help smaller communities. Speeding vehicles is a subject of current interest in the village, particularly in the 40 mph speed limit area from North End to Long Lane. There is a particular perception that HGVs are speeding in this area and into the main part of the village. At the Parish Council's request, Worcestershire County Council made some measurements of speed at the Salt Boxes, about ½ way along the 40 mph speed limit area.



The results demonstrated both speeds measured at each time of day, and the speeds for each type of vehicle over 24 hours. Some further analysis on these sheets highlighted the proportion of vehicles of each type exceeding 30 mph, 50 mph and 60 mph. One positive indication of the results was that 85% of heavy goods vehicles were recorded at less than 44mph, although for cars that drops to 74% at less than 44 mph.

The topic of speed humps, chicanes and road narrowing has been discussed a number of times by the Parish Council and with Worcestershire County Council. There is a general reluctance to speed humps based on their impacts through noise and vibration, especially when HGVs are involved. Whilst chicanes and road narrowing has not been ruled out, it is felt the traffic volumes at certain times of the day may cause more problems than they solve. Finance also becomes a significant issue as, given the measurer traffic speeds are pretty much within acceptable bound, the County Council will not fund such measures and the costs would then have to be met by the Parish Council. Following a further meeting with County Council engineers a plan for a number of measures has been put in place and the Parish Council is seeking funding for these. These include

- 'Gating' at the entrance to the speed limits. This is the white 'gates' that you see by the side of the road at village entrances.
- Dragon's teeth (white triangular shapes on each side of the lane leading up to a speed limit).
- Purchase of Vehicle Activated Sign(s) (VAS) placed within the various areas of the village, in addition to the one we have a share of for one month in three..
- Refresh the markings on the road at the entrances to the speed limits.

We have spoken with the police over enforcement. The Road Safety Partnership are reluctant to give any undertaking as to how often they may target specific areas. There is however an exercise in progress in relation to matters at Ridgeway Farm, Throckmorton, and the police superintendent for the area has said that there will be a number of vehicle check events taking place in the area which include speed enforcement, and that he understands how this may help with issues in Pinvin. The likelihood of any fixed speed enforcement equipment is nil as the road does not fulfil the County Council's criteria which include the number of fatalities and serious injuries that have occurred over the past years

There is a Community Concern initiative starting up which will involve members of the community undertaking speed checks. Whilst these do not result in prosecutions, the police do write to those found exceeding the speed limit to suggest they may amend their ways. These are intended to take place throughout the speed limit areas in the village at some point in the future.

Nature Notes

NOW Spring has come

It seemed quite dark and dreary just before 7am but my mood changed as I heard Blackbirds singing. NOW Spring has come I decided. There have been many signs recently. Dunnocks, great tits, skylarks and some thrushes have all been singing and of course robins who sing in the dark where there is artificial lighting. But blackbirds delight us in other ways. They can be noisy, so active in the garden, flying and chasing each other then swooping low round bushes and people. There can be several groups for a long time. They love to eat pyracantha berries, holly berries and stale even, brown apples. Many small birds use the bird bath sharing with others. In the kitchen many Ladybirds have been crowded round upper windows. My winter flowering shrubs such as honey suckle and Mahonia usually attract bees but there are very few. Today I was surprised to see two large Bumble Bees fly by.

Goldfinches such regular feeders on my seeds have been pecking in the grass with other small birds. There seems to be too much moss in all my grass due to so much damp. Will the grass ever recover? Do keep looking at the ground and on and under trees where you can for unusual sights. In his kitchen last week my son suddenly noticed a large shape on a damp cloth. As he went to pick it up. it was quite a rare specimen, an Emperor Moth. Not in season and not flying at this time Though not very colourful it was beautiful with "eyes" on both forewings. It was soon recorded as a new entry for Worcestershire for this year at the Biological records office at Smite.

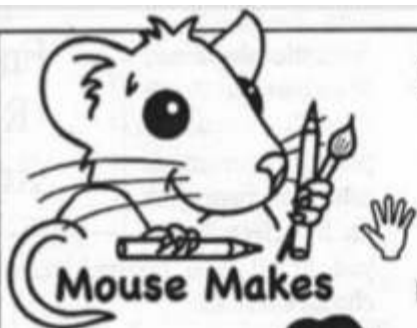

What's Cooking? QUICK PAELLA

1 Onion-finely chopped
25 g / 1 oz butter
1 Red Pepper deseeded and finely chopped
150 g / 5 oz chorizo sausage-sliced
900 ml / 1½ pints vegetable stock
½ tsp smoked paprika
200 g / 7 oz cooked Tiger Prawns- peeled
2 tomatoes-finely chopped

1 clove garlic-crushed
225 g / 8 oz long grain rice
75 g / 3 oz frozen peas
½ tsp turmeric
2 Tbsp chopped parsley

1. Fry onions and garlic for 2-3 minutes in butter
2. Add red pepper, rice chorizo and fry for 2 minutes
3. Stir in stock; add spices
4. Bring to boil, and then simmer for 10-12 minutes until rice is tender
5. Stir in prawns, peas, tomatoes & parsley; serve hot.

Don't Give Up Something for Lent!

Sir

In 2014, one of the faith leaders on Radio 2's Pause for Thought advocated to do 40 nice things over Lent for strangers or people who were not expecting a good turn, rather than giving something up. I found the whole effort most problematic, not because it was hard to spot things I could do, but because people are suspicious or wary when something nice happens to them. Almost everyone thought I must have had an ulterior motive.

It would have been easier to give up sweets for 40 days, rather than trying to buy a packet of scones for the woman in front of me in the supermarket, who wanted them but had run out of money. She accepted, but the whole queue seemed to think I was odd.

The same was true of the homeless girl in the rain who was worried about taking my umbrella. I had to reassure her that I could get dry again!

This recent letter to the *Daily Telegraph* reminds us that it isn't always easy to do good, even when we want to.

However, it would be an interesting challenge this year if instead of giving up something for Lent, we tried to do something a bit different. Perhaps a kindness? Or a phone call, text or letter to encourage someone? Or just finding a few moments for a quiet reflection
