Notes from Pinvin Parish Council

Dog fouling:

The problem of dog fouling remains a concern on the playing fields and fields adjacent to Main Street, despite numerous green dog waste bins located around the vicinity. The Parish Council has sought advice from Worcestershire Regulatory Services and a dog warden will be visiting the village in the near future to offer their support. Dog walkers are politely reminded to use the dog waste bins provided at the playing fields, School Close and Main Street (tied up bagged waste can also be deposited in litter bins) and to note the following advice from the County Council.



It is an offence for a dog owner not to clear up after their dog has fouled on any open public land. Districts are patrolled regularly and council's Street Scene wardens can issue an on the spot fine of £75 to any person who fails to clear up after their dog (see below). In certain circumstances we may choose to prosecute the individual instead, and the Courts can impose a maximum fine of £1000.

The Health Risks

Dog faeces can contain bacteria that can make people sick, or the eggs of the roundworm *Toxocara canis*. If these are ingested they can make people very ill and the roundworm can cause blindness in children. Dogs should be wormed four times a year. Children should not play around runs/kennels, should always have their hands washed before eating and should be prevented from putting grass in their mouths. Always use separate dishes for your dog and wash them up separately and you should not share food with your dog. However, there are no health risks to you from immediately clearing up after your dog as the eggs of the *Toxocara* worm take over two weeks to hatch and become active.

Advice for the dog-walker

Encourage your dog to foul on your property before/after the walk. Always carry something to clear up after your dog. If your dog fouls in a public place then put a bag over your hand and pick it up with your protected hand. Turn the bag inside out around the faeces and tie a knot in the top of the bag. Deposit it in a dog waste bin (if you are not sure where these are, contact us or your Town/Parish Council) or take it home and put it in your dustbin.

How can the public help us to prevent dog fouling? If there are areas that are badly fouled, please let the Council's Street Scene teams know so that they can deal with them. The Council's Street Scene teams may be able to cleanse public areas that are badly fouled. The contact telephone number for each district can be found below.

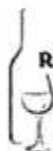

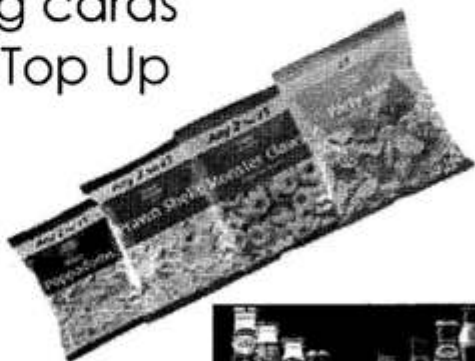
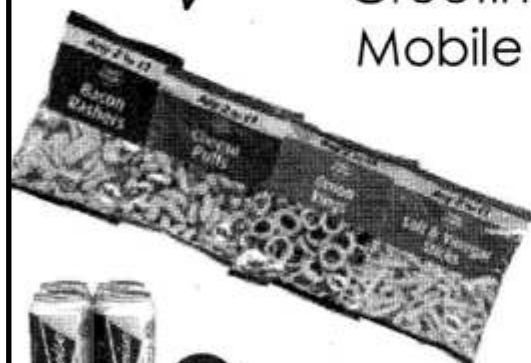

Nature Notes

A cold but colourful Spring

The damp corner of my garden resembles a meadow. At present it is covered with stems of Fritillary flowers. Rather like upside down tulips the Snakes head fritillary is pale lilac about 12 inches tall. Alongside grows Lady's smock another wild flower like a delicate wall flower and coming up are masses of cowslips, we have been walking all over the rosettes of leaves; A real flowery meadow area. Nearby white and lilac violets pepper the lawn.

Small birds still eat from my feeders. While the temperature remains wintry and the wind strengthens spring appears to be on hold. There are certainly more large bumble bees many with rear red colours but very few days with butterfly conditions. One afternoon produced a small Tortoiseshell and two others. The greater spotted wood pecker is easy to pick out on my willow tree. This has been well shaped so there are no leaves. One day it pecked so fast into the bark it appeared like tiny wings fluttering.

My neighbour saw 9 toads swimming in her larger pond. Toads feed at dusk on more sedentary creatures like slugs, worms, snails and beetles. At breeding times toads tend to return to their birth place.

The female will have laid her eggs in a circle passing over and under leaves. Then fertilisation takes place with much croaking. Tadpoles then tiny toads will be produced.

In gardens as the yellow daffodils die off, more colourful hyacinths appear, with brilliant blues and pinks and perfumes to match, and delight us.

JOIN THE DOTS TO FIND AN EASTER VISITOR

What's Cooking? EASTER EGG NESTS

300 g / 12 oz white chocolate

30 g / 2 oz butter

2 Tbsp golden syrup

150 g / 6 oz shredded wheat

4 Tbsp chocolate spread

150 g mini eggs

1. Break chocolate into squares, place in a heavy based pan with butter and syrup.
2. Melt mixture over a low heat until soft.
3. Crumble shredded wheat into mixture and stir well.
4. Divide into eight portions on a baking sheet (non-stick) on a baking tray. Shape into nests - Cool.
5. When nests are firm warm chocolate spread. Spoon a teaspoon into the centre of each nest and fill with mini eggs.

This is what the Church looked like for the Carol service last Christmas Eve, we all had a good time and the young children were involved in setting up the crib.
