

Notes from Pinvin Parish Council

Allotments

Work is currently underway by the Parish Council in preparing areas of allotment land ahead of the new growing season.



New tenants are most welcome - If you are interested in acquiring an allotment plot please contact a member of the Parish Council or Clerk for further details. A standard half plot costs £10.00 per year.'

Dog fouling: Advice for the dog-walker Encourage your dog to foul on your property before/after the walk. Always carry something to clear up after your dog. If your dog fouls in a public place then put a bag over your hand and pick it up with your protected hand. Turn the bag inside out around the faeces and tie a knot in the top of the bag. Deposit it in a dog waste bin (if you are not sure where these are, contact us or your Town/Parish Council) or take it home and put it in your dustbin.

How can the public help us to prevent dog fouling? If there are areas that are badly fouled, please let the Council's Street Scene teams know so that they can deal with them .The Council's Street Scene teams may be able to cleanse public areas that are badly fouled. The contact telephone number for each district can be found below.

Still Changes in May

The clear skies have been kind to our spring blossom, trees, bulbs, climbers and shrubberies. So we had beautiful colours, long lasting flowering beds wall climbers and pond plants. In damp areas fritillaries, wild bulbs have extended their flowering times lasting weeks. I only saw one redwinged lily beetle. These are a pest and can ruin gardens, bulbs vanish for ever.

Often Beeflies have been seen. I notice their shadows as they fly with horizontally positioned wings. The orange tip butterfly prefers Cuckoo flowers, same as Ladies Smock. I have hundreds of these so it was delightful to see swarms of these on a warm day. It does not happen too often.

My neighbours have been so intrigued by the business of a wren, building a nest with many leaves though we have masses of moss. That they wait for the empty nest so they can learn more. The greater spotted woodpecker has been much quieter than before but has been making yet another perfectly round nest hole. Because the tree still has to grow this season's leaves I have been able to watch him from the house to see his head move at a fast rate as he drills this year's hole.

My first visit this year to the wetland looked at first very disappointing .There seemed to be no coots or moorhens only ducks and two swans but not a pair. Then overhead there appeared several martins. I was delighted. Since then I have had reports of swallows in the village.


PLANTS WANTED!

JOIN THE DOTS TO FIND SALLY SNAIL'S BIG FRIEND

What's Cooking? QUEEN OF PUDDINGS

4 eggs -separated

200 g / 8 oz caster sugar

6 Tbsp raspberry jam

6 Tbsp soft white breadcrumbs

425 g / 17 oz carton Ready-made custard

Flaked almonds

6 Ramekin dishes

- 1. Preheat oven to 180°C Gas Mk 4.
- 2. Whisk egg whites until stiffened and gradually whisk in sugar.
- 3. Spoon 1 Tbsp jam into base of each Ramekin; top with a Tbsp white breadcrumbs.
- 4. Mix 2 of the egg yolks into the custard and divide between the Ramekins. Top each dish with meringue.
- 5. Sprinkle with flaked almonds and bake for 20 minutes until golden.
