

On 23rd March we held a very successful 'Chocolate Bingo' night! Other events include Discos held at the school, seasonal fayres and sponsored events.



Notes from Pinvin Parish Council



- At the recent May Annual meeting of the Parish Council, Cllr Steve Mitchell was re-elected as Chairman, and Cllr Alasdair Mustard as Vice-Chairman.

- The Wychavon Youth Bus will be paying its first trial visit to Pinvin on Thursday 1st June from 1-2pm, at Pinvin First School. This new initiative has been planned in conjunction with the Parish Council for younger parishioners who are aged between 8-17 years old. The youth bus team look forward to welcoming those interested on board.

Allotments

Work is currently underway by the Parish Council in preparing areas of allotment land ahead of the new growing season.

New tenants are most welcome - If you are interested in acquiring an allotment plot please contact a member of the Parish Council or Clerk for further details. A standard half plot costs £10.00 per year.'

Speed initiatives: As outlined in the last edition of Pinpoint, the Parish Council is seeking funding in order to implement a number of measures proposed to address the problem of speeding in the village. Following guidance from County Council Highways, work is now well underway in preparing an application for submission to the District Council to utilise some of the Parish's New Homes Bonus allocation in order to fund these initiatives.

Help still needed for the PCC

Rogation Sunday Service on May 21st at ORCHARD FARM - Owletts End.

The Rogation service took place in the large barn at Orchard Farm, 34 people attended and enjoyed the singing which was beautifully led by "The St Georges Ladies Choir". We went into a field to look at the Crops and then to see the Sheep and Lambs in another field. There were some new born lambs for the children to see at the far end of the barn.

Whilst walking in the field we passed an ancient and quite rare “Persnore Black Pear Tree” The Worcestershire Black Pear is the County symbol. It’s on the county’s flag and our County Cricket team is known as The Pears.

At the end of the service lots of tea and cake were consumed, a collection was held on behalf of R.A.B.I (*Supporting Farming Families*) and raised £109.

A big thankyou goes to the Brooks family, Alan, Kate and Daniel for hosting our Rogation Service.

West Wall Repairs.

Finally the work is complete to the West Wall and also the outside of the porch has been pointed. The stone masons started doing their work and found that some pointing on the west wall did not need doing. (If it’s not broke don’t fix it! It’s their philosophy) The stone masons had a copy of the original faculty and repair schedule, they noticed that the porch also needed quite a lot of work doing to it – so they did the outside work ALL for the same cost and in the same time frame – a really good job.

Evidence of volunteers in and around Pershore making a difference

Last year more than 200 volunteers contacted us and 135 used our face-to-face recruitment service to discuss the opportunities on offer and decide which would best suit them. They are now volunteering for 61 different roles within 34 organisations; 22 of which are Pershore based or working directly with clients in and around Pershore. As a result, 13 organisations are up to full capacity and can achieve more for their clients and the community. In the same timescale, our volunteers drove clients who are unable to use public transport to 2,000 medical appointments and 4,600 social activities. These comprised 6,600 journeys by car or minibus, totalling 57,500 miles.

SEE HOW LONG YOU TAKE TO FIND TEN DIFFERENCES

What's Cooking? FRESH FRUIT SALAD

Strawberries are at their best in June, so why not use them as the base of a luscious fruit salad?

100 g / 4 oz caster sugar

150 ml / $\frac{1}{4}$ pt white wine

2 Tbsp each of lemon and orange juice

2 sprigs of mint

2 oranges -peeled and sliced

375 g / 12 oz strawberries-hulled and cut in half

1 small mango-peeled, stoned and diced

250 g / 8 oz black seedless grapes

1. Place 300 ml / $\frac{1}{2}$ pt water in a pan, add sugar and wine. Heat gently until sugar dissolves. Bring to the boil and simmer for 5 minutes
2. Take pan off heat, add lemon and orange juice. Add one sprig of mint and cool syrup.
3. Add fruit to cold syrup and chill.
4. Spoon into serving dish and garnish other with mint sprig.
