Howard Lawley

In the 1891 census, John Lawley, 33, a railway signalman and Sarah aged 31, lived in Hanborough, Oxon with Sarah aged 5 and William aged 2.

There are records in Chipping Norton of John Howard Lawley being born in March 1896 in Hanborough and then John Lawley marrying in September 1900 in Chipping Norton to Mary Ann Surch.

In the 1901 census, John 43, a railway signalman and Charles William 12 lived at 1, Pershore Terrace, Pinvin whilst Mary Ann Lawley, 38 and Howard, 5, lived with her parents, John and Harriet Surch, in New Street (Finsbury Place) Chipping Norton.

By the 1911 census, John, cited as a railway signalman from Rock, Worcestershire and married for 11 years to Mary Ann Lawley, who was born in 1863 Salford, Oxon were living in Pershore Terrace, Pinvin with son John Howard Lawley, aged 15, a market gardener.

Howard was resident in Newport, Monmouthshire at the time of enlisting into the 2nd Battalion Monmouthshire Regiment, but transferred into the Welsh Guards, 1st battalion in May 1915. He went to France in October 1915 .He was a Private and died on 24th August 1918 in France. He is buried at the Bucquoy Road Cemetery, Ficheux, France. He is commemorated in St. Nicholas Church, Pinvin and the Memorial Hall, Pinvin.

Vincent Frederick Gibbs

Vincent Frederick Gibbs (25) married Mary Ann Playden (23) at St. Nicholas Church on 17th September 1887 but Vincent died aged 35 on 14th August 1897 before his son Vincent Frederick was born in 1898 in Pinvin. Vincent was baptised in St Nicholas Church, Pinvin on 28th August 1898.

In the 1901 census Mary, cited as being 37, a widow and working in garden, lived with her sons Sidney 10, Vincent 2, their sisters Emily, 9 and Edith, 7 and brother-in-law George 27, a gardeners assistant in The Row, Pinvin.

By the 1911 census, the head of house is now G. Gibbs, who is 37 and a foreman Market gardener in Pinvin. He lives with his sister in law widow, housekeeper Mary Ann Gibbs, now 47, nephew Sydney George 20 single, market gardener, nephew Vincent Frederick 12, schoolboy, nephew Walter 7, schoolboy; all living in the Cottage in the Garden, Pinvin.

Vincent enlisted into the London regiment, 20th battalion, Blackheath and Woolwich. He was a Private and killed in action 30/8/1918.

He is commemorated at St. Nicholas Church, Pinvin, reported as missing on Memorial Hall, Pinvin and at the H.A.C Cemetery, Ecoust-St.Mein, France. His brother Sidney was killed, aged 25, in the Somme on 31st October 1916.

Nature notes

The end of June and still only a single call of a cuckoo has been heard. The azure skies continue with sapping heat. A song thrush on the topmost twig of a nearby 40 foot conifer is a most melodious and welcome accompaniment to regular horticultural tasks

The fragrant and heady perfume of the white flowered Locust trees near the Coach & Horses, and the more delicate scent of widespread Lime trees has been a delight. The dry warmth of the climate has brought a bumper crop of grasses with their copious pollen. As we live by the clock rather than the sun, there is an early call at first light from anxious blackbirds watching a neighbour's cat, either venturing out or returning for breakfast.

In very dry conditions and tidy gardens mean fewer invertebrates and the birds are pleased to accept supplementary supplies. They also appreciate a sheltered lawn to take the sun, and form queues for the bird bath. There are some butterflies about, mostly meadow browns, and this morning a red admiral. It is a sorry state to have a diary entry noting seeing an earwig, when small life forms were so common in gardens and hedgerows. We must be more understanding stewards of our countryside heritage.

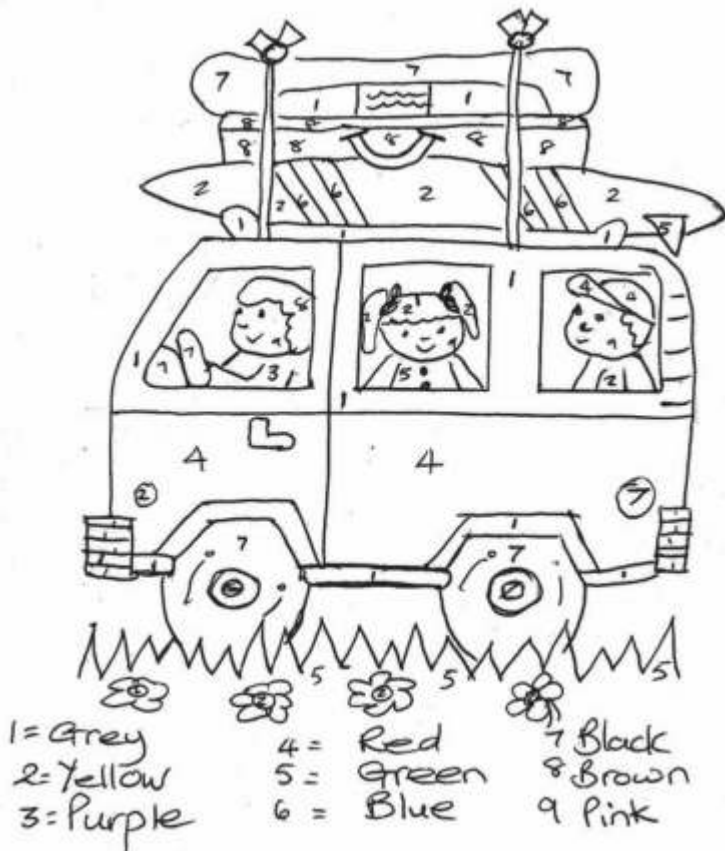

What's Cooking? TUNA AND SWEETCORN PASTA

300 g / 12 oz spiral pasta

200 g / 8 oz sugar snap peas

4 spring onions

2 tsp oil

2 x (185 g) tins Tuna chunks in oil

1 (198 g) tin sweetcorn

2 Tbsp mayonnaise

1. Cook pasta in a large pan of boiling salted water until soft.
2. Slice sugar snap peas, finely chop spring onions, drain the tuna and sweetcorn.
3. Cook sugar snap peas with pasta for the last few minutes of the cooking time.
4. Fry spring onions in oil until soft.
5. Drain pasta and return to pan; add onions, sweetcorn and mayonnaise- stir until the pasta is coated with the mixture
