Dear Friends

Like so many people I was completely mesmerised by the story of the Thailand youth football team who were trapped in cut off caves for nine days before rescuers were able to locate them, and then had to endure a few more days being trapped as a complex rescue operation took place. It's a miracle, that all the boys and their coach were rescued.

The boys gave one press conference where they talked about how thankful they were about being rescued and how they were going to spend some time being Buddhist monks thinking about what had happened to them and making sure that they never forget the lessons they have learned from the experience. It's not just the boys that learned something, because wherever children are they will always have so much to teach us too.

In June I visited Musifini B Primary School in Morogoro, Tanzania, which is linked with Pinvin Federation of Schools. I met the headteacher, Mrs Anna Tarimo, and she shared with me how amazing the children were. They worked hard and were really focussed on doing well so that they could have the best possible start in life. And all of this taking place in a community that struggles for resources and support that our schools would take for granted.

The children in our midst are a real blessing and we can hope that they too will be able to achieve all that they can to give them the best opportunities in life. For many of our children Pinvin Federation of Schools is vital in inspiring and encouraging them on that journey. It's exciting times for the Federation as Mr Steve Payne begins works as the new Executive Head this September. We all look forward to getting to know him, not just at school but in the wider community as well. So as the new school year starts hopefully we can find a moment to think about all of our children and give thanks for those who teach and inspire them.

Zambian students' exchange visit

Pershore Rotary club's meeting on Wednesday, 4 July 2018 rang to the sounds of young voices when students and teachers from Pershore High School and the Lubuto High School in Ndola, Zambia visited the club on the 2nd day of their 2018 student exchange visit.

This year's exchange follows a 15 day visit by Pershore High School's 6th Form students in 2017 and continues an exchange lasting over 13 years and involving over 100 Pershore students. The objectives of the exchange are to enhance the students' understanding of the varied and diverse cultures of the world and the Zambian students will be fully immersed in Pershore life during their visit and plan to visit the Malvern hills, Pershore Abbey, Stratford- Upon-Avon and London.

Pershore Rotary President, Richard Williams, welcomed the students and teachers to the club, saying that it was a real pleasure and honour to have the opportunity to meet them during their exchange visit. Leane Watkin, Pershore High School's exchange co-ordinator, introduced the students from Pershore HS and thanked the Rotarians for helping raise funds for the visit through the 'Back to the 80s' concert held in Pershore Abbey on 28 April 2018. The task of introducing the Zambian students was given to Muleya Muchindu, the exchange co-ordinator for Lubuto High School. She introduced each of the 4 students who, in turn, spoke of their hopes and expectations of the visit. There followed a general Q&A session with the Zambian students covering a wide variety of subjects, including educational facilities in Zambia, schooling, class sizes of 100+, university opportunities, food, climate and the weather.

President Richard Williams then gave each of the Zambian students a Pershore Rotary certificate recognising their visit to the club. It also came to light during the meeting that Muleya Muchindu's father is a Rotarian in Zambia, so she was given a Rotary club banner to take home.

In winding up, Richard Lees thanked the whole exchange team for their enthusiastic contribution to the meeting. He explained that Rotary's 2018-19 theme is to 'Be the Inspiration' and hoped their visit would inspire them to encourage and support others through life.

Rotary has been involved with youth exchanges for over 60 years, providing incredible opportunities for young people to see the world, experience a different way of life, maybe learn another language, make international friends and discover a

Nature notes

The end of August and we have had some welcome rain, benefiting gardens and our wild creatures and plants. Some trees, particularly birches have struggled. Only a few house martins and swallows remain, the cuckoo and swifts returning south in early August. The wires and roofs are now filling with starlings which have had a successful season raising chicks. Mixed bands of titmice are visiting the fat ball and a solitary squirrel has eagerly harvested many of the hazelnuts. Hope he can remember where they are cached!

Small numbers of butterflies and more numerous day flying moths are about, as are large green and black dragonflies. A few apparently lazy houseflies are looking for easy pickings in the kitchen, but have a good turn of speed when the fly swat is brought into play. A pity one cannot recruit the services of the enthusiastic bats which appear mid-evening and flit entertainingly about, usually overhead, but one was giving chase to prey at shin height the other evening.

Fruit is generally plentiful this year, with blackberries now swelling with the newly fallen rain. They had been looking rather hard and unappetising before.

Small skeins of geese honk past my window in the early morning, a sign of approaching autumn.

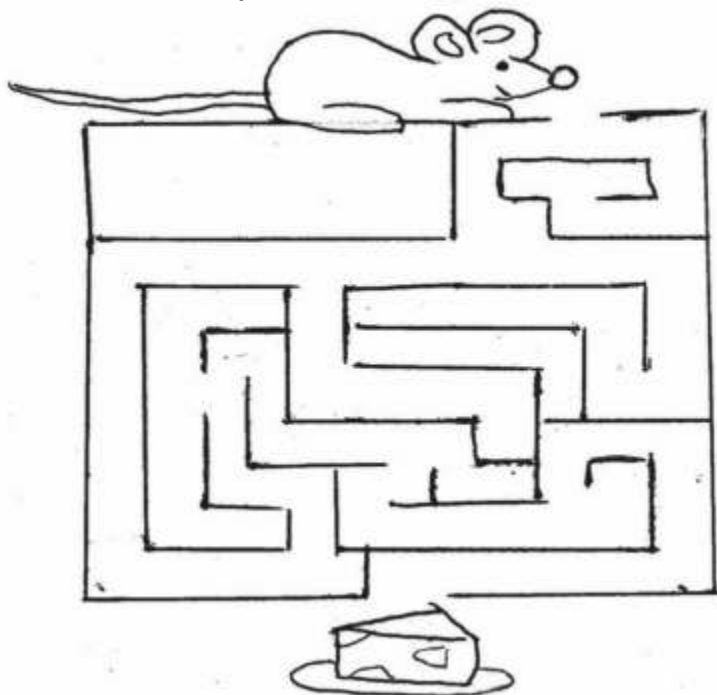

***What's Cooking?* SEAFOOD CRUMBLE**

1 Tbsp oil

1 Onion-chopped

1 jar ready made white sauce (400 g)

Seafood cocktail-defrosted & drained

225 g / 8 oz Cod fillet-cubed

2 Tbsp chopped chives or spring onion

100 g / 4 oz flour

75 g / 3 oz butter

75 g / 3 oz oats

3 Tbsp fresh parsley

1. Preheat oven 200°C/ Gas 6
2. Heat oil & fry onion for 2-3 minutes
3. Warm sauce and add fish
4. Rub Butter into flour until it looks like breadcrumbs, add parsley & oats
5. Spoon fish mix into ovenproof dish, top with oat crumble and bake 25-30 minutes until golden
