Pinvin Parish Council Update.

The new playground equipment has been installed. This was paid for through Section 106 funding.

The parish council hopes that the children of Pinvin will get a great deal of enjoyment from it over the years.

Pinvin Parish currently has a New Homes Bonus grant allocation of £19,610 from Wychavon District Council . The parish council would like to submit proposals for how we would like to spend this money. Four ideas have been put forward – a community orchard, playground equipment for older children 10yrs+, a dog agility course and a large wooden shelter with seating. A door to door survey was recently carried out in the village to find out which idea appealed most to residents. The results of this survey, based on people's first choice, is:

Playground equipment for children aged 10yrs+	44% of respondents
Community orchard	40% of respondents
Dog agility course	2% of respondents
Large shelter	2% of respondents

The Localism and Community Officer for Wychavon District Council was informed of the results of the survey and, as the top two projects were of equal value to the residents, it has been decided that we can put in a bid to fund both of them. This will be done in the next couple of months.

Nature Notes

We await the promised heavy rain, which can be life-threatening to young nestling birds. Only if a parent can cover all in the nest will they stay dry enough to keep warm. I was very pleased to see 10 swifts together yesterday afternoon. Three was the maximum seen to date, so hopefully some are this seasons youngsters.

No house martins seem to have returned to Pinvin this year, which is disappointing, but there is one swallow nest reported.

Nature fits around us even if we don't notice. Some garden pots had unfamiliar leaves growing. On examination they were seen to be walnuts germinating, so presumably we have a forgetful squirrel gardening.

Dawn chorus is presently often punctuated by alarm calls from anxious blackbirds worried by cats returning home after a night on the tiles.

When out walking, shiny beetles run helter-skelter for the cover on the other side of the dried mud of the footpath.

WHAT'S COOKING?

Meat Pasties

Ideal for Picnics or with summer salads

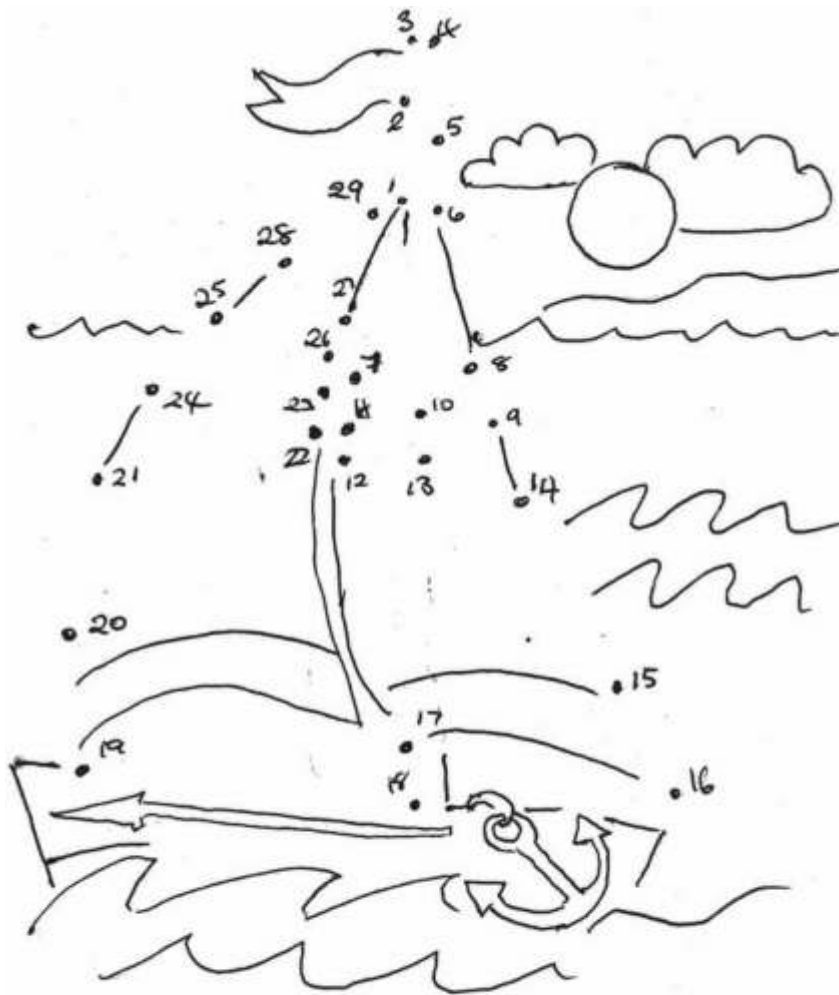
- 1 lb/ 450 g short crust pastry
- 12 oz/ 300 g shoulder lamb or stewing steak-finely diced
- 1 large potato- finely diced
- Salt & pepper to taste
- 1 onion-finely chopped
- 1½ Tbsp chopped parsley
- 1 Tbsp stock or water

1. Divide pastry into 8 pieces and roll each into a 5" / 13cm circle
2. Mix together all the filling ingredients and divide between the pastry circles
3. Damp edges, fold in half and seal
4. Flute edges and place on a greased baking sheet
5. Brush with milk or beaten egg and bake for 10 minutes

at 200° C / 400° F / Gas 6

6. Reduce temperature to 180° C / 350° F / Gas 4 for 45 minutes.
7. Serve hot, cold or freeze until needed.
